Jane Normile has been teaching these classes and would love some assistance. You need not assist every month or you can share the duties with her. Call or email her for more information.




Stitches Scotch Stitch

"Which stitch" is holding you back from stitching??? You are not sure which stitch to use because there are so many!! Well, here is an article that can help you with selecting your stitch.


The Scotch Stitch has many variations. It is part of a group that was years ago called Box Stitches. This meant that the stitch patterns formed squares or boxes. These boxes are laid out in horizontal, vertical or diagonal rows. Each box can also be laid in a line with the corners overlapping. The stitch can also share the short stitch.

These stitches are good for borders, roofs, large buildings, homes and other box stitches. They are also beautiful in geometric patterns. This stitch is best with thread that fills the hole. This would work for silk threads but not floss. To give the best effect, choose a needlepoint yarn that comfortably fills the holes, without leaving any bare canvas showing.





Diagonal Scotch Stitch is a cousin to the regular Scotch stitch; however, it is worked on the diagonal in a continuous diagonal line. It is made up of stitches that span over one canvas thread, over two, over three threads and move then over back to the threads of three again. It looks like a continuous run of small squares when stitched into the canvas.





Alternating Scotch Stitch is a stitch that is used to arrange stitches in different ways to fit your canvas. Stitch it in a single color, overdyed color or multiple colors. In the example below, it is Scotch in one block and basketweave in another box. Here you get a **checkerboard effect** (which perhaps explains the Chequer Stitch name).

There are a lot of needlepoint shops, needlepoint teachers and needlepoint authors that can provide additional knowledge on how to use each stitch. To learn more, contact your local shops, check on YouTube, join an online stitching club or contact a member of our chapter!! Help is always available!



After careful consideration, the ANG Board of Directors has decided to move forward with a change in how our annual dues will be paid. Beginning in January 2022, all membership dues will be paid on an annual basis, in January. This applies to all memberships of 1, 2, 5 and 10 years duration and in all countries. If your membership renewal date is between October and December 2021, please pay your annual dues as usual. In 2022, all membership dues will be paid in January, and will be prorated to account for the new annual schedule.

This change will provide benefits to ANG in reducing the time and effort spent in managing the dues renewal process, providing more timely information for budgeting purposes, and simplifying the membership verification process for chapters.

ATTENTION TO A CHANGE FOR MEMBERSHIP PAYMENT OF LOCAL ANNUAL DUES

Affective January 1, 2022, American Needlepoint Guild (ANG) is changing to an annual membership date for renewal for all their membership.

As a local chapter, Gateway ANG is also changing the membership renewal date. It will also be Monday, January 31. This means that all of our members should pay their annual local chapter dues by the last day in January 2022. This will cover everyone's membership through the year until next January 2023.

This change in timing for local dues will reduce the confusion of when to send payment renewals to ANG and when to renew local dues. This is also reducing the mail traffic that happens all year between the Treasurer and the Membership chair.

This change in local dues payment will not be prorated this year like it is happening for ANG. Instead, for local dues payment this year only, we are lowering the price for our membership for 2022 to \$11:00. This is to smooth out the local dues process and to try to give to you a part of your payment back and a chance to appreciate you for holding on to your membership with us through these hard and unusual times in a Covid-19 world.

(Members who paid their dues in November and December have until February 28 to pay 2022 dues.)
