I want to buy a canvas to be finished into a purse, what should be considered when selecting the canvas? I think I want the canvas to be made into a pillow. What are the finishing pillow options? This is a great opportunity to learn, see samples and ask all those questions.

April 20 Program: Spring Cleaning Stash Day

We all have items in our stash that we purchased with good intentions but now the intentions have changed. Like what was I thinking? Well now is your chance to share those items with your fellow ANG members in good standing and give them the chance to own them, let's call it "needlepoint opportunities" or "sharing those good intentions" with your fellow ANG members. Members are allowed to bring up to 10 items (canvas, accessories, thread bundles -count as 1 item). All items must be labeled with the sellers name and priced before the sell. Seller's items are to be packed up or boxed and bought to the meeting. After the meeting sellers will set up their shop. Pre-selling not allowed. Once all the shops have been set up the selling will begin. Buyers will be given labels to put their names on and place a label on the item they want to buy. Sellers and buyers can shop at the same time. After the sale is over the buyer will figure up the sales and give a bill to buyers. Buyers must pay with cash or check payable to the seller. Sellers are responsible for having cash on hand to make change when necessary. The event is not a fundraiser, it is an opportunity for our members to decrease their stash and/or increase their stash. So start getting ready to set up shop for the April program. Remember to bring cash and checks so you can buy. This is going to be fun!!!

Stitches from *The Crafter's Choice*

Do you often question yourself ... "which stitch" should I use??? Are these questions holding you back from stitching??? Is it because there are so many stitches and you are not sure which stitch to use??

Here is an article that might help you with selecting your stitches.

Bargello is a great beginner needlepoint method that has reached a popular level in the last few years, especially during the Covid years. Bargello is often selected as a modern embroidery design but can also be translated as quilt designs. It is sometimes known as a popular needlepoint stitch Hungarian that is also easy to stitch! Simple straight stitches become geometric designs with bright colorful patterns.

The canvas is usually a mono or interlock choice and usually is white because the threads cover the canvas. Select a slightly thicker thread, such as wool, Persian, or a crewel yarn.













Bargello patterns are defined by their pattern – curve pattern, flame pattern, and the simple zigzag pattern.

- Zigzag pattern is easy to work, with peaks of identical size and a nine-stitch repeat.
- Flame pattern stitch is worked over four threads with an upward or downward step of one thread.
- Curve pattern includes stitches worked in blocks, creating a curved look. Be sure to include one strong color.

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There are a lot of needlepoint shops, teachers and authors that can provide additional knowledge on how to use each stitch. 
