2017 - 2018 Monthly Programs

For 2017-2018, we are concentrating on one large project, Patterns and Posies. It is a beautiful piece designed by ANG Master Teacher, Joan Thomasson, which she taught at ANG National Seminar 2016.

There are 2 meetings to choose from and all are welcome to stay and stitch between them. Note that the Sept. meeting is on the 4th Thursday!

September 2017

The first meeting of the year is being held on the 4th Thursday instead of the 3rd. Donna Beaman will be presenting the first lesson of our year-long project. The first pattern will be the Rice Stitched border. Bring it completed to the October meeting for a reward. There will also be a lunch after the morning meeting.

October 2017

Donna Beaman will continue by teaching patterns 1 & 3 of the project. If you complete these sections, a gift is yours! The same holds true for November – bring back part 2 completed.

November 2017

Nancy Kinker will pick up where Donna left off, teaching pattern 2. Pattern 2 are staggered stars. Complete this section for a prize!

December 2017 NO MEETING

January 2018

Linda Lesh will teach patterns 4 & 5, featuring a Broken Byzantine stitch and a complex pattern of diamonds and “snowflakes”. Hope you are keeping up with this project as the incentives continue.

February 2018

Eileen Chalk will demo patterns 6 & 8. Patterns 6 & 8 are both complex patterns of mosaic, star and straight stitches. **Keep your eye on the prize!**

March 2018

Ellen Ippolito will take over and illustrate pattern 7. The overdyed and gold fibers are wonderful in this section. Your incentive awaits!

April 2018

Julie Cook will take the reins from Ellen and dissect patterns 9 & 10. Two more complex stitches with a scotch variation. Color, color and more color! Also, elections for officers will be held.

May 2018

Kathy Scioneaux will complete the patterns by adding the posies in the center square. Buttonholes, whipped web, leaf stitches and the first stitch of needlepoint, basket weave, make up this square. New officers will also be installed.

June, July and August 2018

Monthly Stitch-In's -- Join us for a once-a-month fun-filled day of stitching at a member's home during the summer months.
